Financial Criteria	Must meet <u>CA income and resource guidelines</u>	Gross income must be at or below 200% FPL
Immigration Criteria	The household must include <b>at least one</b> person who meets the immigration criteria for NYS-funded CA's Safety Net Assistance (SNA) program. (Refer to BPLC's <u>Immigrants' Eligibility Chart</u> for details.)
