Impairment Related Work Expenses (IRWE) The cost of certain impairment-related services or expenses and items that a disabled person needs to work can be deducted from gross earnings when calculating monthly SGA. BWE's apply only to SSI claimants and can be used as a deduction in calculating the SSI benefit amount.
