[Cash Assistance for Beginners](#)

The Cash Assistance (CA) program is an income support program of last resort for many low-income families and individuals in need. There are complicated rules to determine who is included as part of a household and how much income will count towards eligibility. We will simplify these eligibility rules for beginners and also cover how the CA grant is structured and how much is allocated for rent, immigration criteria, and how to calculate a household's benefit amount (the standard of need) when there is income.

[Coordination Between Cash Assistance and the FHEPS Program](#)

The Family Homelessness and Eviction Prevention Supplement (FHEPS) is a rental subsidy for families with children in NYC who are on Cash Assistance (CA). In this course, we will briefly review key elements of the CA program, including how household size is determined and how income is calculated. We will cover FHEPS eligibility and the FHEPS benefit package, including how the FHEPS subsidy and rent share are calculated.

Cash Assistance for Beginners is a recommended prerequisite for all eligibility factors of the Cash Assistance program.
